Coach Schnoor enters his ninth season as head coach at CAC in 2009-2010. His debut in head coaching was a successful one; during the 2001-02 campaign he led CAC to the Region 1 Championship and a birth in the National Tournament at Hutchinson, Kansas.

Coach Schnoor hails from Minden, Nebraska, where he was a multi-sport star, a two-time All-State performer in basketball and a high school All-American. Chuck was offered many opportunities to play college basketball, which he turned down to accept a baseball scholarship to the University of Nebraska. After two years he transferred to the University of Nebraska Kearney (Kearney State College) where he was a member of both the basketball and baseball teams. He was drafted by the New York Mets Professional Baseball Club as a shortstop and after three seasons in the Mets organization, he took a job as Assistant Head Baseball Coach at the University of North Alabama. After one season, he returned to Nebraska to manage a corporate agricultural business and also coached high school basketball for nine years.

Coach Schnoor has now been a part of the Central Arizona College athletic scene going on thirteen years. Four of those years he served as assistant coach for the women's basketball team. During that time he helped coach both a National Champion and a National runner-up team before being offered the head men's basketball coaching position.

Coach Schnoor holds a B.A. degree in education from University of Nebraska Kearney, a Master's degree in Educational Leadership from Northern Arizona University, and is a member of the Phi Kappa Phi chapter N.A.U. Chuck also serves the college as a Full Time Faculty member.

Justin Kinne enters his third season as an assistant coach for Central Arizona Men's Basketball, and second as Associate Head Coach. Jud, as he is better known, will be working with the Vaquero post player's as well as handling scouting and recruiting. Jud has also brought an innovative strength and conditioning program to the Vaqueros, which will have immediate and long term results.

Coach Kinne is entering his eleventh season on the sidelines, despite being only 28 years old, and brings a wealth of experience to the program. He began as a student assistant at Albion College, a highly successful Division III program in Albion, MI, where he worked for Hall of Fame Coach, Mike Turner. Upon graduation in 2003 he went on to help start an NAIA program at Marygrove College in Detroit, MI. After 2 seasons at Marygrove, Coach Kinne had his first stint in the desert, with a year spent at Arizona State University. Jud learned from former National Coach of the Year Rob Evans. Coach Kinne spent the 06-07 season at the nations smallest Division I school, Centenary College in Shreveport, LA. In addition to coaching Jud has worked camps all over the country and has spent 11 summers helping one of the most successful team camps in Michigan. Jud has also traveled to China on a trip sponsored by Nike and has coached in various pro showcases. Coach Kinne has helped to develop 6 All Americans and 22 All Conference performers in his career, including players who have led the nation in scoring, assists, steals, and 3pt shooting. He has worked with 8 players who went on to play professionally, including current Harlem Globetrotter Will Bullard.

Jud and his wife Amanda had their first child in March of 2008, a daughter Madilyn Grace Phoenix Kinne.
