Our officers are sworn, certified and trained in accordance with Arizona state standards. They have full police authority and power of arrest. It is a great asset for CAC to have its own police department. Our officers provide more than enforcement; they are a vital part of the college experience by being public relations officers as well. We are about the campus providing help to those in need of assistance. Our officers are here to help you and we encourage you to report any problems you may have.

The personal safety of students, faculty, staff and visitors is our highest priority. We wish you a safe and successful school year.

INTRODUCTION

The Student Right to Know and Campus Security Act of 1990, recently renamed “The Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security and Crime Statistics Act”, was enacted by Congress and signed into law in November of 1990. In 1992, and most recently in 2000 and 2008, Congress significantly amended the law via the Higher Education Opportunity Act, expanding the reporting criteria.

In compliance with the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act, the Central Arizona College Police Department has published this report to provide its students and employees with an overview of the college’s security resources, policies, and procedures, as well as crime statistics and fire safety information. The report is updated annually and is made available to all students, employees, and applicants for admission and employment.

LAW ENFORCEMENT AUTHORITY

The Central Arizona College Police Department is a full service public law enforcement agency, established by the Pinal County Community College District Board of Governors, in and by the authority vested in them by the legislature of the State of Arizona, for the purpose of providing law enforcement, security and safety services on property owned or controlled by the College.

The Department is located in the Everingham Student Center, Building I, on the Signal Peak Campus, and is staffed with a combination of police officers and civilian personnel. Together, they provide law enforcement, safety and security services that are individually tailored to meet the needs of each campus. Our law enforcement staff, who are referred to as Police Officers, are armed and vested with full law enforcement powers, including the authority to make arrests. Police Officers are on duty at the Signal Peak Campus 24 hours a day.

Campus Security personnel are used to provide safety and security protection at the Superstition Mountain Campus, and the Pinal County Sheriff’s Office provides police coverage to the Aravaipa Campus. A close working relationship is maintained with the local law enforcement agencies in each area. Police services in the Casa Grande, Coolidge, Florence, San Tan, Maricopa, and SaddleBrooke Centers are provided by the local police agencies having jurisdictional control at each location.

Police has mutual aid agreements and cooperates fully with local and state law enforcement agencies, including the Coolidge and Casa Grande Police Departments, the Pinal County Sheriff's Office, and the Arizona Department of Public Safety.

CRIME AND EMERGENCY REPORTING PROCEDURES

Central Arizona College encourages students, employees and others to report all criminal action and emergencies as soon as possible:

- To report a crime or emergency on the Signal Peak Campus, the caller should contact the Police Department at (520) 836-9655.
- To report a crime or emergency occurring at any of the other CAC satellite campuses or centers, the caller should contact the local emergency operator by dialing 911.
- Emergency blue light phones- These two-way call boxes are located strategically at the three campuses. They allow an individual in need of assistance to speak directly with a public safety agency. The agency will dispatch the appropriate emergency response to the caller. Blue light phones are for emergency use only.

When reporting a crime or an emergency, try to call from a safe location. Remain calm and be prepared to answer the following questions:

- The location of the emergency, including the campus address and the exact location of the incident on campus.
- The nature of the emergency (fire, medical, hazardous material, etc.)
- How many people are injured and the extent of their injuries?
- How did it happen?
- When did it happen?
- Your name and telephone number
- Do not hang up until instructed to do so by the dispatcher

CONFIDENTIAL REPORTING PROCEDURES

If you are the victim of a crime and do not want to pursue action within the college disciplinary system or the criminal justice system, you may still want to consider making a confidential report. If this is the case, you may report the details of the incident without revealing your identity to any Police Officer by calling (520) 494-5445 during regular business hours. Police can also be reached via email at cacpolice@centralaz.edu but remember it may be a few minutes before the email is read; if an immediate response is required please report via telephone.

Reports filed in this manner are counted and disclosed in the annual crime statistics for the institution. With such information, the college can keep an accurate record of the number of incidents involving students, and possibly determine where there is a pattern of crime with regard to a particular location, method, or assailant, and alert the college community to potential danger.

CRIME AWARENESS AND PREVENTION

The Central Arizona College Police Department believes that it is better to act early to prevent crime rather than react to it after it has been committed. Ultimately, we are all responsible for our own safety/security and the safety/security of those around us. Members of the CAC community are encouraged to participate in and be aware of the crime prevention programs that are available to them. The following is a list of crime prevention programs that are offered to the community:

- **Security Escort Service.** Escort services are available upon request at the Signal Peak Campus.
- **Crime Prevention Material.** Printed crime prevention materials are distributed at crime prevention presentations.
- **Crime Prevention Presentations.** Members of the Police Department are available to talk to any student or employee group on any of our campuses/centers. These talks are designed to educate members of the campus communities about security and safety issues, and various techniques that can be used to prevent crime on campus.
- **Sexual Assault Awareness, Education and Prevention.** In cooperation with the Office of the Dean of Student Life, prevention presentations can be made upon request.
- **Facility Surveys.** Comprehensive safety and security surveys of campus buildings and grounds are conducted at each campus by the Police Department.
- **Motorist Assist Program.** The Motorist Assist Program is a 24-hour service that provides jump-start and vehicle lockout services to people on campus.
- **Found Property Program.** The Police Department is designated as the official campus location for receiving and storing found property. Individuals wishing to inquire about an item they have lost on campus should contact the Police Department either in person or by telephone.

In addition, numerous efforts are made to advise members of the campus community, on a timely basis, of all campus crime and crime related problems, to include the following:

- **Annual Security and Fire Safety Report.** A comprehensive annual report of crime related information is compiled, published and widely distributed at each campus and is available to all members of each campus community. The report also includes fire safety information.
- **Student Newspaper.** The student newspaper, "The CACTus", publishes a bi-weekly summary of all criminal incidents with distinctions made for each campus. The summary is prepared based on information provided by the Police Department.
- **Daily Incident/Fire Log.** The Police Department maintains and records a daily log of all department activity, including crimes that are reported to campus authorities and local law enforcement. The log also includes crime information at the college's satellite campuses and centers, and a list of fire incidents. The log is updated daily and available upon request at the office of the Police Department.
- **Timely Warning Bulletins.** In the event of a major crime or incident that poses a threat to students, employees, or others, a "Timely Warning Bulletin" is prepared and distributed by the Police Department via campus e-mail and by posting flyers throughout the campus. Once a problem is identified, these notices are typically posted within twenty-four hours.

TIMELY WARNINGS

In the event that a situation arises, either on or off any campus, that, in the judgment of the Chief of Police, constitutes an ongoing or continuing threat, a campus wide "timely warning" will be issued. The warning will be issued through the college e-mail system to students, faculty, staff and the campus student newspaper, *The CACTUS*. If the information constitutes an immediate threat, the college's emergency warning system may be used to disseminate the warning.

Depending on the particular circumstances of the crime, especially in all situations that could pose an immediate threat to the community and individuals, the Police Department may also post a notice on the Police web site at:

notification. In such instances, a copy of the notice is also posted in each residence hall, and at bulletin boards throughout the campus.

Anyone with information warranting a timely warning should report the circumstances to the Police Department, by phone (520-836-9655) or in person at the police station at the Everingham Building, I-103.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE CAC COMMUNITY

Your safety on campus is vitally important. The key to a safe and secure environment is cooperation. Members of the campus community are expected to assume a certain amount of responsibility for their own personal safety and the security of their personal property. The following safety and security tips are provided as guidance.

- Report all suspicious activity to Police, or local police department, immediately.
- Never take personal safety for granted.
- Try to avoid walking alone at night.
- Carry only small amounts of cash.
- Never leave valuables (wallets, purses, books, cell phones, laptops, etc.) unattended.
- Carry your keys at all times and do not lend them to anyone.
- Lock up bicycles and motorcycles. Lock car doors and close windows when leaving your car.
- Do not leave valuables in your car, especially if they can be easily noticed.
- Engrave serial numbers or owner's recognized numbers, such as a driver's license number, on items of value.
- Inventory your personal property and insure it appropriately with personal insurance coverage.

Contact the Police Department at any time if you have any questions or would like additional safety suggestions.

SEXUAL HARRASSMENT POLICIES

The College is committed to providing and maintaining an environment that respects and protects the rights of all its members. Sexual harassment deprives its victims of rights guaranteed under Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964. Sexual harassment will not be tolerated at Central Arizona College.

Recognizing that sexual harassment is both a real and a difficult problem, the College has developed a well-defined, resolution-oriented procedure to respond to complaints of sexual harassment. Any such procedure must emphasize accessibility, confidentiality, and the protection of civil rights, civil liberties and academic freedoms. This can be accomplished by providing maximum access to the resources of the College to those who feel they have been harassed and to offer a procedure that is clear, understandable and fair to those whose behavior is called into question.

Any student, faculty or staff member who needs more information regarding sexual harassment can contact the Human Resources Department at telephone number (520) 494-5235. A detailed sexual harassment complaint procedure can also be obtained from this office.

SEXUAL ASSAULT POLICIES

Central Arizona College is committed to preserving the dignity and safety of its members. Any form of unwanted sexual activity will not be tolerated. Unwanted sexual activity simply means any sexual activity to which any party involved does not give full and free consent. A verbal "NO," no matter how insecure or indecisive, constitutes a lack of consent. Date rape is unwanted sexual activity and is defined as any forced, manipulated or coerced intercourse by a friend or acquaintance.

A student or employee who is charged with unwanted sexual activity can be prosecuted under Arizona criminal law and disciplined under the College's disciplinary system. Criminal prosecution and College disciplinary action operate independently of one another.

During a College on-campus disciplinary case, the accuser and the accused are entitled to the same opportunities to have others present during the disciplinary hearing. Sanction for sexual assault may include a variety of disciplinary actions, up to and including termination, expulsion and/or criminal prosecution.

After an alleged sexual assault incident occurs, the college will assist the victim in changing academic and on-campus living situations, if so requested and if such changes are reasonably available.

SEXUAL ASSAULT REPORTING PROCEDURES

Rape or sexual assault may happen to anyone, at anytime and anyplace. Should you become a victim of sexual assault, some of the immediate reactions you may experience may include anger, disbelief, anxiety and

fear. No matter what your reaction, you should do two things: (1) Report the crime to law enforcement, and (2) Seek medical attention. Above all, don't try and face the situation alone. Call a family member, a friend, your clergyman or a faculty member, but get some help. These people can offer support and assistance.

Reporting the crime to law enforcement is the first step in apprehending and convicting the assailant. Rapists are frequently repeat offenders. If you do not report your attacker, he is likely to hurt someone else. Telling the police what happened to you does not mean you have to prosecute. You can tell them everything you remember about the attacker and nothing about yourself. If you chose to prosecute, the authorities will pursue the crime to the fullest extent of the law. In any case, your situation will be handled discreetly, and your name will not be released to the press. You will not be prejudged, nor will you be blamed for what occurred. You will be treated with courtesy, sensitivity, dignity, understanding and professionalism.

If you become the victim of a sexual assault on or off campus:

- GET to a safe place.
- REPORT the crime as soon as possible after it occurs.
- DO NOT shower, bathe, douche, change or destroy clothing.
- DO NOT disturb or straighten up the area where the assault occurred.
- SEEK medical attention.
- SEEK emotional support from the local Rape Crisis Center. (520-836-0858)

Medical care is important for both physical and psychological reasons. It is also important from the standpoint of evidence to help substantiate your situation. You will be assisted in arranging for any hospital treatment and other medical needs, and the cost of the rape examination is paid for by the criminal justice system.

REGISTERED SEX OFFENDER INFORMATION

A federal law, the Campus Sex Crimes Prevention Act amendment to the Jacob Wetterling Crimes Against Children and Sexually Violent Offender Registration Act, requires registered sex offenders register with the local police authority when they are enrolled or employed at institutions of higher learning. The Police Department maintains information about registered sex offenders on campus who are required to register as sex offenders under state and federal law, and who have complied with their obligation to register with the Police. Persons seeking to obtain sex offender registration information may contact the Police Department in person, during regular

business hours, or by visiting the Arizona Department of Public Safety's web site at <http://www.azsexoffender.com>.

ACCESS AND MAINTENANCE OF CAMPUS FACILITES

Central Arizona College is a public facility. All campus buildings and facilities are open to the public during normal business hours; however, certain areas may have restricted access. Buildings are unlocked in the mornings and secured in the evenings. No external activities are permitted while the campus is closed, without express approval of campus administration.

Loitering is not permitted on campus; any canvassing, peddling or soliciting requires prior approval of the Vice-President for Student Services. Police are instructed to request identification via a college ID card from staff and students when the police officers deem necessary.

Keys to college facilities are issued to employees only, based on a need for access, and the loaning or duplication of keys is strictly prohibited. District-wide cooperation is expected between faculty, staff, and students to assure that doors are secured once they have been used. Students must obtain authorization from a faculty member to gain access to a building after the scheduled closing time.

District facilities are maintained by the Facilities Department. Facilities and landscaping are maintained in a manner that minimizes hazardous conditions. Police personnel regularly patrol the Signal Peak Campus and report malfunctioning lights and other unsafe physical conditions to the Facilities Department for correction. They promptly address any problems identified during these inspections.

The Facilities Department maintains the ability to respond on a 24-hour basis to correct significant discrepancies related to safety and security. This response facilitates prompt repairs to buildings and equipment deficiencies that present an immediate risk to the campus community. Members of the campus community (all campuses and centers) are encouraged to report safety and security problems to the Police Department – any time of the day or night – by dialing (520) 836-9655.

ACCESS AND MAINTENANCE OF RESIDENCE HALL FACILITIES

The main access doors to residence hall rooms and hallways at Signal peak are required to be locked 24 hours a day, seven days a week, thereby providing students reasonable safety, security and privacy. Students are

issued keys to access these doors as well as the doors to their rooms. Students are continually encouraged to lock their rooms and discouraged from propping open any doors. Building locks are changed on a regular basis, and locks are also changed immediately when a lost key poses a security threat to building residents.

It is an individual's responsibility to lock and maintain access control to his/her residence hall room. Police and Residence Life staff members routinely monitor building access and encourage resident students to assist by keeping exterior doors locked and not using objects to prop open locked doors. If a properly identified person is locked out and requires access to a room, either a resident assistant or Police officer will grant access. In the case of inoperable locks, a locksmith is available through the Facilities Department.

Each new resident student is provided with a Student Handbook that amplifies the information in the housing contract regarding safety and security in Residence Life. These sources, supplemented with other handouts, provide students with an awareness of their rights, responsibilities, rules, regulations and important information regarding dangerous and inappropriate activities that are prohibited at the College in order to safeguard the security and well being of others.

Entry into the area of the residence halls is limited to authorized college staff members, resident students and their registered guests. Guests to residence halls are the responsibility of the person they are visiting and must abide by all residence hall rules, including the campus escort policy, which provides that all guests to a residence hall must be escorted by the person they are visiting at all times while inside the residence hall. Both the Residence Life Staff and the Police Department closely monitor residence hall safety and security. Entry by college staff into a student's residence hall room is limited to the following:

- By law enforcement officers in the line of duty and in accordance with legally defined procedures governing search and seizure.
- By authorized custodial and maintenance personnel for the purpose of making improvements and repairs and to provide routine maintenance.
- By authorized college personnel for the purpose of conducting a room inspection to ensure that health, fire and safety standards are maintained.
- By authorized college personnel, in an emergency situation, to provide for the health, safety or welfare of a student or to make emergency repairs to prevent damage to property.

ALCOHOL AND DRUG POLICIES

Central Arizona College complies with all federal, state and local laws, including those that regulate the possession, use and sale of alcoholic beverages and controlled substances. The distribution, possession or use of any alcoholic beverage, illegal drug or controlled substance is strictly prohibited on College premises. Students, faculty staff and visitors are subject to arrest and criminal prosecution for any drug or alcohol violation on campus. In addition, disciplinary sanctions may be applied to students, to include administrative probation, suspension, and/or expulsion from the College.

The abuse of alcohol and other drugs is of serious concern to the college community because it can interfere with the well-being and education of students and the job performance of faculty and staff. Drug and alcohol abuse can cause serious and long lasting damage to an individual's health. Drug and alcohol abuse may endanger the safety and well being of the abuser, the abuser's family and friends and of students, staff, faculty and the general public.

The abuse of alcohol and illicit drugs may have profound health consequences. Consumption of illicit drugs and alcohol may significantly impair judgment and coordination, increasing the risk of vehicle accidents and the incidence of a variety of aggressive acts, including criminal assaults. The consequences of drug abuse may include disorientation, convulsions, psychosis and other severe mental disturbances, respiratory depression, coma and possible death. Consumption of certain drugs or moderate to high amounts of alcohol may cause marked impairments in higher mental functions, severely altering a person's ability to learn and remember. In very high doses, alcohol may cause respiratory depression and death. When drugs and alcohol are combined, much lower amounts can produce these effects. Drug abuse and long-term alcohol abuse can also lead to permanent damage to vital organs, such as the brain and liver.

WEAPON POLICIES

Possession of any firearm, ammunition or other lethal device, by any person other than a sworn police officer, or a police cadet directly involved in a police academy training exercise, is strictly forbidden on all campuses and centers, except as authorized by state law. Violations of this policy are subject to discipline and/or criminal prosecution.

DISCRIMINATION, BIAS AND HATE CRIME POLICIES

Central Arizona College is committed to providing a learning environment free from unlawful discrimination including bias and hate activities. Bias motivated hate activity includes, but is not limited to, a crime committed solely because of a person's race, religious beliefs, disability, sex, nationality, or sexual orientation; racist leaflets and/or offensive printed materials; verbal, written or physical contact resulting or intending to result in intimidation, fear, personal assault and/or other violence.

All students, staff, faculty, prospective students and visitors to the college should be aware that the college will take appropriate measures necessary to eliminate such actions. Those who so act are subject to the college discipline and applicable legal action under Arizona State and Federal law. Report any act of discrimination including bias and hate activities to the Police Department.

CRIME STATISTICS

The next section of this report focuses on the federal reporting requirements under the “Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act”. Central Arizona College must produce and distribute an annual report containing crime statistics and statements of security policies. In preparation for collection of these statistics, crime statistics were requested from the following sources: the Central Arizona College Police Department, the Pinal County Sheriff’s Office, the Maricopa Police Department, the Apache Junction Police Department, the Florence Police Department, the Casa Grande Police Department, the Coolidge Police Department, and non-police officials referred to as Campus Security Authorities (college employees who have significant responsibility for student and campus activities).

Enrolled students and current employees are informed about the availability of the Annual Security Report by notifications in the fall class schedule and other various sources. This notification includes a brief summary of the contents of the Annual Security Report and also includes the address for the CAC web site where this report can be found online and how to request a printed copy of this report.

DEFINITIONS TO SUPPORT THE ABOVE CRIME STATISTICS

Crime Definitions. The following definitions are those outlined in the Federal Bureau of Investigation's National Incident-Based Reporting System and are used as the standard of reporting in the information above:

- **Murder:** The willful killing of one human being by another.

- **Negligent Manslaughter:** The killing of another person through gross negligence.
- **Forcible Sex Offense:** Any sexual act directed against another person, forcibly or against that person's will. Includes forcible rape, forcible sodomy, sexual assault with an object, and forcible fondling.
- **Non-Forcible Sex Offense:** Unlawful, non-forcible intercourse. Includes incest and statutory rape.
- **Robbery:** The taking, or attempted taking, of anything of value from one person by another, in which the offender uses force or the threat of violence.
- **Aggravated assault:** An attack by one person upon another, in which the offender uses or displays a weapon in a threatening manner or the victim suffers severe injury involving apparent broken bones, loss of teeth, possible internal injury, severe laceration, or loss of consciousness.
- **Simple Assault:** An unlawful physical attack by one person upon another where neither the offender displays a weapon, nor the victim suffers obvious severe or aggravated bodily injury involving apparent broken bones, loss of teeth, possible internal injury, severe laceration, or loss of consciousness.
- **Intimidation:** To unlawfully place another person in reasonable fear of bodily harm through the use of threatening words and/or other conduct but without displaying a weapon or subjecting the victim to actual physical attack.
- **Burglary:** The unlawful entry into a building or other structure with the intent to commit a felony or a theft.
- **Theft:** The unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another person.
- **Motor-vehicle theft:** The theft of a motor vehicle, including automobiles, trucks, motorcycles and mopeds.
- **Arson:** To unlawfully and intentionally damage, or attempt to damage, any real or personal property by fire or incendiary device.

- **Destruction of Property/Vandalism:** To willfully or maliciously destroy, damage, deface or otherwise injure real or personal property without the consent of the owner or the person having custody or control of it.
- **Liquor-law violation:** The violation of laws prohibiting the manufacture, sale, purchase, transportation, possession, or use of alcoholic beverages. Does not include driving under the influence or drunkenness violations.
- **Drug-law violation:** The violation of laws prohibiting the production, possession, distribution, and/or use of certain controlled substances and the equipment needed to produce or use them.
- **Weapon-law violation:** The violation of laws prohibiting the manufacture, sale, purchase, transportation, possession, concealment, or use of firearms, knives, explosives, or other deadly weapons.

- **On Public Property Adjacent to Campus:** Is defined as all public property, including thoroughfares, streets, sidewalks, and parking facilities, that is immediately adjacent to and accessible from the campus. If there is a barrier between the campus and the public property, such as a highway that is fenced off, the public property need not be included.

ANNUAL FIRE SAFETY REPORT

Central Arizona College's Residence Life facilities at Signal Peak are protected by several fire warning systems. The Towers housing area is completely covered by an integrated automatic sprinkler and fire alarm system, and includes fire doors and walls. The quad areas are protected by a fire alarm system and smoke detectors. Fire extinguishers are strategically located throughout the Residence Life facilities.

The fire alarm systems are monitored by staff and Police 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Basic fire safety instruction is provided to all students living in residence halls during the orientation program at the beginning of each academic year. Basic fire safety instruction is also offered to all new employees during new employee orientation program.

Each resident is given a copy of the *Residence Life Fire Safety* brochure during orientation, which includes information on fire safety and what appropriate action to take during a fire alarm or fire emergency. Every student room has an emergency evacuation map installed on the inside of the front door as well, to direct occupants to primary and secondary exits. Fire exit drills are conducted once per semester, they are coordinated with the Police and Regional Fire Departments.

REPORTING AND EVACUATION PROCEDURES

If a fire is detected or the fire alarm sounds, evacuate the area. Isolate the fire by closing doors as you leave. Do not attempt to extinguish fires unless you have been trained on the proper use of portable fire extinguishers. Activate the nearest fire alarm if it has not already been activated. Report the fire to the Police Department by using a telephone in a safe area to call (520) 836-9655.

Upon hearing a fire alarm, evacuate the building by stairs and exits. Do not use elevators. Once outside the building, stay out and move away from the building to clear access for the fire department and other emergency responders. Do not re-enter the building until expressly advised that it is safe to do so by fire department personnel or Police officer. Any fires that were quickly extinguished or any evidence of recent fires must be reported immediately to a Residence Life staff member or Police officer, who will document the incident as required.

PREVENTING FIRES

To minimize the potential for Residential Halls fires at the Central Arizona College it is the policy of the College to prohibit open burning and the use of combustible decorations at all times (unless in accordance with other policies and procedures, and/or authorized by the authority having jurisdiction). Open burning as defined by the College is any open/exposed flame or combustion that produces heat, light, or smoke, and has the potential to cause a fire. Examples of open burning are, but not limited to, candles, incense, bonfires, campfires, barbecue grills, and their related accessories such as: gasoline, propane, lighter fluid, charcoal, and pyrotechnics.

All decorations and ornaments must be of fire-resistant or non-combustible material, U.L. rated and approved for use. They shall not be hung or posted on any fire protection equipment (fire hose cabinets, fire extinguishers, sprinkler heads and piping, smoke detectors, fire alarm pull boxes, etc.), on or near exits, on or near exit or emergency lights, on or near any other protective or operating feature provided by the College, or in any manner that could present a fall or trip hazard, or impede egress.

Removal of all decorations, ornaments, and displays are required immediately after the event or prior to the College's annual holiday closure. Decorative lights including holiday lights, as well as floodlights, extension cords, or electrically operated ornaments must be U.L. rated and approved for use. Electric lights or electrically operated ornaments shall not be used on metal, aluminum, or any other similar metal, which could induce an electrical shock.

Only heavy duty extension cords and decorative lights in good condition (free from damage or exposed wiring) shall be used for decorations, must be unplugged at the end of each day, and removed after the event or holiday season. Extension cords or decorative lights may not be routed under rugs or carpets, through doorways, or in any manner that could present a fall or trip hazard, or impede egress.

It is the policy of the College that only artificial holiday trees will be used and shall be of fire-retardant or non-combustible material. Indoor trees must be placed out of the way of traffic and must not block doorways, exits, exit signs, or any of the fire protection equipment, or placed in any manner that could present a fall or trip hazard, or impede egress.

FIRE LOG

The Police Department maintains a fire log at each campus administration office, similar to the required crime log. The log has information, for each fire, as to the nature of the fire, the date and time the fire occurred, and the general location of the fire.

SMOKING POLICY

Smoking, use of smokeless tobacco, or other tobacco products are prohibited in buildings or close proximity of entrance doors of any building and in any vehicle which is owned or leased by the College. This includes, but is not limited to, any classroom, residence halls, laboratory, library, faculty office, administrative buildings, or dining facility.

MISSING PERSON PROCEDURES

The Higher Education Act requires that all institutions that provide on campus student housing must establish a missing student notification policy and procedures. Central Arizona College takes student safety very seriously. The following policy and procedures have been established to assist in locating Central Arizona College students who live on campus housing and based on the facts and circumstances known, have been determined to be missing.

DEAN OF STUDENT LIFE- INFORMATION TO RESIDENCE HALL STUDENTS

At the beginning of each academic year, the Central Arizona College Dean of Student Life will inform all students residing in on-campus housing that the Dean of Student Life will notify either a parent or an individual selected by the student not later than 24 hours after the time that the student is deemed to be missing. The Dean of Student Life shall also notify the Police Department. The information provided to the resident students will include the following:

- Resident students have the option of identifying an individual to be contacted by the Dean of Students not later than 24 hours after the time that the student has been determined to be missing. Students can register this confidential contact information through the Dean of Students Office.
- If the resident student is under 18 years of age, and not an emancipated individual, the Dean of Students is required to notify a custodial parent or guardian not later than 24 hours after the time that the student is determined to be missing.
- Once the Police Department has been notified, and it makes a determination that a student who is the subject of a missing person report has been missing for more than 24 hours and has not returned to campus, the Dean of Student Life will initiate the emergency contact procedure in accordance with the student's designation.
- These requirements do not preclude implementing missing person procedures in less than 24 hours if circumstances warrant faster implementation.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

The Police Department, upon notification of a missing Residence Life student, will conduct a thorough law enforcement investigation and obtain all necessary information in accordance with the police department's written procedures for missing persons. These procedures include notification to the Dean of Student Life. The Department will conduct a thorough search of all campus buildings and parking lots, utilizing all available resources.

The Department may also request assistance from Residence Life staff or others to assist in a search on campus, and will request assistance, when needed, from outside law enforcement agencies.

NOTIFICATION PROCEDURES

Central Arizona College will follow the following notification procedure for a missing student who resides in on-campus housing:

- Any reports of missing students received by any staff members are to be referred immediately to the Police Department, regardless of the 24 hour requirement.
- If Police determines the student has been missing for more than 24 hours it will contact the Dean of Student Life. The Dean will contact the individual identified by the student, or the custodial parent or legal guardian if the student is under the age of 18 and not emancipated.
- The Dean of Student Life will notify the Vice-President for Student Services of any missing student.

PUBLIC ACCESS DEFIBRILLATOR PROGRAM

Twenty-seven (27) automated external defibrillators (AEDs) are located throughout the district at strategic locations as part of the College's public access defibrillation (PAD) program, administered by the Police Department. The *Cardiac Science* AED units, which provide a lifesaving electrical shock to victims in cardiac arrest, can be operated without any training or previous experience. However, AED and CPR training is made available through the year to those CAC community members who may be interested. EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT PLAN

It is the policy of the College that proper emergency notification will be made, without unnecessary delay and taking into account the safety of the College community, unless notification will compromise efforts to assist victims or mitigate the emergency. Everyone in a College facility - students, faculty, staff, and visitors - must take appropriate and deliberate action when an emergency strikes a building, a portion of the campus, or the entire Central Arizona College community.

Careful planning, with an emphasis on safety, can help the College handle crises and emergencies with suitable responses, and may save lives. Supervisors are responsible for ensuring all employees are familiar with and will follow this emergency plan. Where appropriate, specific staff will be

assigned emergency preparedness and response duties to assist in the implementation of our emergency management plan.

The plan can be located by navigating to the main College's webpage, upper right corner *Quick Links* area, and clicking on the *Emergency Procedures* link. In addition, a *College Emergency Procedures Guide* has been distributed to every employee; copies are distributed to every new employee at orientation. Staff can obtain a copy of the *College Emergency Procedures Guide* by calling Police at (520) 494-5445 or emailing cacpolice@centralaz.edu.

While the structure of this plan remains precisely the same, its implementation may vary depending upon available resources and manpower until the proper administration officials can be notified. Until that time, the individuals assuming the most responsibility will be those officials/individuals of highest rank who are available at the time.

These individuals should seek to follow, as nearly as possible, the guidelines of the plan while simultaneously making an effort to notify Central Arizona College administrators of the situation so as to obtain verification or advice on their actions.

EMERGENCY WARNING SYSTEM

The Emergency Warning System (EWS) is a communications system/protocol implemented to protect life, protect personal safety and provide critical information to the college community. The EWS may be activated in situations involving criminal activity, fire, hazardous chemical release, or other similar incidents. The technology used within the district's EWS consist of a combination of outdoor emergency phone/public address towers, indoor warning devices at each campus, plus a telephone/public address system which utilizes existing telephones throughout the district, including the centers.

The system can be activated on direction from an "authorized individual." This term refers to the College President, Vice-Presidents, and police chief. The authorized individuals have the authority to activate the EWS, or direct any certified user to do so.

"Certified Users" are staff members who have been designated by College Administration as persons who have permission to activate the EWS and have satisfactorily completed the training curriculum prescribed by the Police Department for accessing and activating the EWS. Certified users will

include all members of the Police Department. The authorized individual shall specify the content of the EWS message or the selection of the pre-stored message, and convey that selection to the certified user.

EWS ACTIVATION GUIDELINES

The Police Department shall maintain an up-to-date roster of all authorized individuals (including cell and home telephone numbers) and certified users at each district location, and send a copy of the roster to the President's Office annually. The Police Department shall ensure that sufficient certified users are available during each school day, and that they complete an annual training refresher course provided by the Police Department.

Prior to activating the EWS, the authorized individual should consider the following:

1. Is this a situation where life is in jeopardy and will timely notification protect human life?
2. Is this a situation where public safety is in jeopardy and timely notification may protect the safety of the CAC community?
3. Is this a situation that requires the immediate evacuation of a campus building, multiple buildings, or an entire campus?
4. Is this a situation where there is or will be an unscheduled emergency campus closing, and timely notification may prevent inconvenience to CAC community?
5. Is this a situation involving an emergency outside a campus, but so near one as to affect public safety, and timely notification may protect the safety of the CAC community?
6. Is this a situation that requires immediate notification to and/or immediate response from a critical group of CAC staff members?

If the answer is yes to any of the above questions then the EWS should be activated. The authorizing individual shall determine to what groups the message shall be sent. It is possible that an emergency may occur of such severity that immediate activation of the EWS is necessary to ensure immediate preservation of human life. In such cases, a certified user may

activate the EWS if an authorized individual is not present, or if attempting to contact an authorized individual will create an unacceptable delay. In such instances, the certified user will make every attempt contact an authorized individual immediately after EWS activation to ensure notification.

The Police Department will conduct an annual test of the full EWS, to include all elements of the system at every campus and center. A report of said test results will be included in the department's monthly report. It is the responsibility of the Police Department to ensure a monthly test of all district emergency telephones is conducted at all campuses.

CAMPUS/CENTER EVACUATION OR CLOSURE

If it is determined that a campus/center evacuation or closure is necessary due to an emergency situation, all personnel and students will be notified by the senior administrator on duty of the nature of the evacuation/closure, via the EWS, and where to evacuate to (usually to home), and when it is safe to return to the campus. The senior administrator on duty will ensure that coordination of any evacuation includes immediate notification to the President's office.
